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
CAYMAN AGRESSOR IV

CAYMAN ISLANDS – 7 DAYS/7 NIGHTS

DAYS	ITINERARY	DIVES
DAY 0	Afternoon arrivals are met at the airport and transferred to the Cayman Aggressor IV. At 6:00 p.m., dinner is served onboard followed by the Captain's briefing .	---
DAY 1	Dive briefing! Beginning Sunday morning, guests may enjoy up to five dives each day. All dives are conveniently made from the mothership. Excellent snorkeling is available for non-diving passengers. While you are diving, the chef prepares delicious snacks and scrumptious meals, served on schedule. Night diving is offered every night. DAY 2	Diving continues at favorites like Bonnie's Arch , A sandy ravine from the mooring line will lead you to this beautiful, fragile arch. Find the crocodile statue beneath the wall. Tarpon, Filefish, Angelfish and Triggerfish reside near the arch. Devil's Grotto	Up to 5
DAY 3	Trinity Caves is comprised of 4 narrow coral canyons starting at 40 feet and meandering out to 90 feet, where they spill out over the edge of the wall. You'll find Weather permitting, the Aggressor makes an overnight journey to Little Cayman . Here, guests dive famous Bloody Bay Wall , a glorious coral eden starting at only 16 feet!	Up to 5
DAY 4	After a day or two at Little Cayman, the Aggressor speeds to Cayman Brac to explore the Capt. Keith Tibbetts , a 300- foot Russian destroyer. The Cayman Aggressor actually held her in place as the hull filled with water.) The fore and aft cannons, machine gun turrets and missile launcher all remain intact. Snorkelers can easily view the wreck because the command tower lies only 18 feet beneath	Up to 5

DAY 5	<p>the surface. The wreck lies on a sandy bottom a short distance from the shore. Barracuda, French Angelfish, Yellowtail Snapper and juvenile fish call the wreck home.</p> <p>The week culminates back on Grand Cayman with the world famous feeding frenzy at Stingray City. A swarm of friendly Southern Stingrays will beg for food like trained pets in this famous diving spectacle. This world renowned dive takes place in 12 feet of water.</p>	Up to 5
DAY 6	<p>After diving, the yacht returns to George Town at approximately 1:00 p.m. Guests may shop or sightseeing in town.</p> <p>The Captain and crew host an evening cocktail party at 6:00 p.m.</p> <p>The crew will arrange transportation to a local restaurant for dinner</p>	3

FAQ

Passports & documentation

Visitors must have a current passport, adequate funds to support themselves, and a return airline ticket to travel to the Cayman Islands. It is the travelers' responsibility to ensure they have the proper documentation to travel to the destination and return to their country. Please check with the appropriate consulate to ensure you have the proper documentation. Always check your passport and visa requirements. US citizens may go to the US Department of State website at www.travel.state.gov for more information. Aggressor Fleet cannot assume responsibility for passengers not having correct documentation .

Fees & taxes

There are none.

C-cards

Please bring your C-card or proof of certification. The divemaster requires proof of certification before the first dive.

Communications in cayman

The Reservations Center and Cayman Aggressor IV office are in constant communication. In the event of an emergency, family and friends may contact you at the above numbers. The Cayman Aggressor IV office is not open on Saturday. If you need to reach the yacht, please call the boat or office cell phone. As you prepare for your diving adventure on board the Cayman Aggressor IV, we extend a most hearty welcome.

Insurance

Every effort is made to ensure you have a safe trip. However, unforeseen circumstances can and do happen. We highly recommend DiveAssure, Divers Alert Network or an insurance policy of your choice.

Health

The Cayman Aggressor IV has a first aid kit on board, including oxygen. You should also bring motion sickness medicine, an antibiotic, antihistamine, ear-drops, topical ointment or anything else you feel you may need. We recommend a complete physical before your trip. The re-compression chamber is located in Grand Cayman. There is no smoking allowed inside the boat or on the dive deck. Smoking is only permitted on the sun deck .

Arrival

If you arrive in Grand Cayman prior to 12:00 noon on the day of your charter, you are responsible for your own transportation to the boat. Guests arriving after 12:00 noon on the day of the charter will be met at the airport by a uniformed crew member. Cayman taxi regulations do not allow the crew to transfer you to the boat; however, they will assist you with your luggage. At the end of the charter, you will be reimbursed for your taxi fare. If you are already on the island, please make your way to the Cayman Aggressor IV, any time after 2:00 p.m. On Saturday. The Cayman Aggressor IV, docks at the George Town Tourist Dock, however, during the winter months, she occasionally docks off Ann Drive in North Sound Estates. In case you arrive at the airport and cannot locate a uniformed crew member, please call the local contacts. Telephones are located throughout the airport. Don't worry if the Cayman Aggressor IV is not docked in town because of rough seas or weather; there is always somewhere calm you can board the boat.

The yacht

The Cayman Aggressor IV is a 110-foot dive yacht, built and powered for comfort, safety and stability. She is diesel-powered, cruises at 12 knots and has 110-volt power on board. Accommodations include (7) comfortable staterooms, 6 of which have a double and single bed. One stateroom has a queen bed and (2) staterooms each have (2) single beds. All staterooms have individual climate control and TV/DVD. The Cayman Aggressor IV sleeps up to 18 guests in privacy and comfort. She has a beautiful salon, spacious, partially shaded sun deck with chaise lounges and deck chairs, a bar, hot tub, grill, a complete photo center and video editing room. There is a computer station with scanning capabilities in the salon. Phone cards may be purchased to use the satellite communications system for phone calls and incoming/outgoing e-mail.

Meals

The menu on board is varied and plentiful, serving a variety of American feasts, barbecues and local cuisine. Breakfasts feature fresh fruits, hot entrees, cereals and juices. Lunches are buffet-style, featuring hot soups, salads and sandwiches and/or entrees. Dinners are diverse including seafood, beef or chicken. Each evening, enjoy our fresh homemade desserts. Please notify our office of special dietary requests as well as speak to the Chef after boarding.

Beverages

Soft drinks, iced tea, beer, and wine are complimentary. Due to the high duty charged on liquor, we suggest you bring your special brand from the U.S. or pick some up at the last duty-free port before entry into Grand Cayman. Drinking and diving do not mix. Once you consume alcohol, you become a snorkeler until the next day.

Clothing

While on board, dress is very casual. Days are warm, bright and sunny; however, evenings can be cool. We recommend packing a sweatshirt or windbreaker.

Entertainment

There is a variety of nightly entertainment, including diving, fish identification slide shows, and movies. The crew love new releases of DVD movies, musical CD's, recent magazines, and books. Feel free to bring along your favorites.

Diving

The crew of the Cayman Aggressor IV, with their unique combination of talents, offers the ultimate service. While on board, you may pick a buddy of your choice, or dive with one of the crew members. There is ample storage space for your diving equipment in your personal locker. The Cayman Aggressor IV provides 80 cubic ft. tanks, weight belts, and weights. The stern and platform area are very spacious. The boarding ladders were designed for convenience to allow divers easy entries and exits. Enjoy the warm, fresh water showers on the back deck after your dives and dry off with a warm towel.

Dive Gear Suggestions

We suggest you pack the following: mask, fins, snorkel, and regulator with visible pressure gauge, depth gauge, buoyancy compensator, dive watch, and dive light, safety sausage, mirror, Dive Alert and/or other safety devices. Dive computers are mandatory for each guest. Each piece of gear should be marked with waterproof paint or tape. You will be diving in water that averages 78°–82°. Most guests make as many as 4-5 dives each day, so some sort of protection is needed. A 3mm wetsuit or shorty is recommended. Cayman law does not permit gloves when diving.

Conservation laws

Conservation laws do not permit spear fishing or collecting in the Cayman Islands.

Rental dive equipment

A full line of rental dive equipment is available including regulators, BCs, dive computers, and night lights.

Certification courses

The crew of the Cayman Aggressor IV offers a variety of certification and specialty courses such as Master Diver, Open Water Certification, Open Water Check- Out Dives, Advanced Open Water, UW Photographer, and Nitrox.

Underwater video/dvd

Our video professional can capture your diving adventure onboard the Cayman Aggressor IV to share with family and friends.

Photo /video equipment

All Aggressor yachts offer complete photo/video facilities with a full line of Digital photo equipment. Photo-pros are available for free coaching with equipment rental. Photo equipment is available to rent separately, or as a complete set-up. (reserve in advance to ensure availability) The Cayman Aggressor IV has a battery charging station and large camera tables for your camera and video equipment. Guests should bring their own battery chargers.

Ship's boutique & credit cards

There is a mini-boutique on board with assorted t-shirts, shorts, film, batteries, and miscellaneous items. The Cayman Aggressor IV accepts cash, Travelers Checks, Visa, Discover, MasterCard & AMEX. Many credit card companies are charging an international fee. If this happens to you, please contact your credit card company.

Friday

Tabs for onboard services or purchases are settled on Friday morning. Friday afternoon, the Cayman Aggressor IV returns to George Town to provision and fuel for the following week. This is your opportunity to go duty-free shopping or sightseeing. The Cayman Aggressor IV hosts a sunset cocktail party Friday evening at 6 p.m. Dinner is not served on board which is the only meal not provided with the cruise. Cayman has many fine restaurants which the crew can recommend.

Crew gratuity

We believe gratuities should be voluntary and based upon the quality of service the crew has provided. When settling your bill on Friday, the Captain will have an envelope for gratuities that will be divided equally among the crew.

Checkout

If you do not have plans to extend your stay in the Cayman Islands, we recommend an early morning departure. Checkout time is between 7:00 and 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning. The crew will transport you to the airport or to your hotel in the George Town area.
